The homeowners spent more than three years looking for a site on which to build their smaller custom home. After an endless search for the perfect lot, they decided to purchase a 3,700-square-foot urban townhouse at Avenue Road and St. Clair Avenue, just a short stroll to Yonge Street and the trendy shops of Yorkville. Naturally, there was extensive work required throughout the 25-year-old house.

With the help of Mark Rosenberg of Mark Rosenberg Design Build Inc., they embarked on a redesign and renovation that was most suitable to their needs.

The three-storey townhome has three distinct living areas, which include private quarters for their son still living at home. The plan boasts a new, larger mud room off the rear lower level that leads to the double-car garage (sometimes a rarity in the city), a main floor designed for living and entertaining, as well as the master retreat on the third floor. Additionally, the home was wired with a sound system allowing music to be heard throughout.

Ideal Gathering Spot

The redesigned main level is ideal for their changing lifestyle. The original small galley kitchen was transformed into a large open-concept kitchen/great room and is the heart of the home where friends and family gather and linger over dinner or a glass of wine. All of the walls were removed in the rear of the home to create a modern, white kitchen/great room featuring Caesarstone countertops and a dark zebra stained island.

The kitchen now opens onto a large deck with a glass railing overlooking the lush zen garden. The huge expanse of windows across the back of the house, and marble wall surrounding the wood burning fireplace in the kitchen/great room, adds to the elegance of the home and its bright open space. Attention to detail and lighting were a must for these avid art collectors to showcase their favourite pieces.

Dark ebony-stained hardwood flooring in the kitchen/great room and dining room complement the honed marble tiles laid throughout the living room and

front foyer. The new, large single-storey traditional dining room was converted from a small, two-storey dining room to accommodate the gymnasium on the second floor above.

At the front of the house, the formal living room is ideal for privacy and enjoying a favourite novel. The unique, painted wall panels add to the formality of the living space, yet exude a very cosy and welcoming feeling.

The master bedroom features a glass wall with views to the west and an elegant linear gas fireplace with built-in book shelves on both sides. A large walk-in closet with stained wood doors can be
